CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2021

Welcome to the Manly Baseball District Association annual general meeting 2021.

To say that the last 12 -15months have been challenging is probably an understatement. The lingering effects of the Covid pandemic continue to echo across our lives. For the most part our local competitions have returned to normal but the specter of Covid is still present.

Despite that we have seen the slow relaxation of restrictions and a general return to normalcy around the diamond. In fact, MWDBA has just hosted the Intermediate (U13) and Junior League (U14) State Titles at Aquatic over the Eater weekend. To quote a former US President; "it was a yuge weekend!" I have continuously lobbied Baseball New South Wales to host this event at Aquatic and this will be the 3rd time in 5 years that we have hosted. The reality is there are very few permanent baseball facilities in Sydney and we have one of them! The State Titles weekend was well attended by supporters of all teams competing and the canteen did very well.

As you all know our grounds were under threat of being taken by the State Government (to relocate Forest Highschool) and whilst we have not received 'official' confirmation that the proposed high school will NOT be built on Aquatic the unofficial communication is that the site is not acceptable. Probably because it is an old tip site which continues to subside and has all sorts of nastiness buried below. As such I believe the RSA Board has breathed a collective sigh of relief that the grounds are now secure.

With the relocation debacle and Covid behind us the RSA Board can now refocus on the most pressing issues facing baseball in our association. In no particular order I believe these to be improvement of the Aquatic facilities, growing player numbers across all competitions, implementing a standardized and consistent representative baseball program, implementing standard coaching and umpiring training across all competitions, improving and evolving our governance and finally, improving the communication and relationship of all competitions in the MWDBA Association.



I am sure you will agree that the aforementioned list contains a number of important issues. The RSA Board will prioritize them and set in motion plans to get them done. To that end I am excited about where our organization is headed. In the past two years I have observed a significant positive shift in how the RSA operates. The idea that we are in a boat and that we must all row together at the same cadence to go anywhere is a message I have been preaching.

I believe we are almost there in the sense that the recognition we are 'One Manly' is taking hold. The whole of Manly is much greater than the sum of its parts and I genuinely believe that our Association is in the best position of any to capitalize on the synergies that 'One Manly' can offer. So, watch this space.

None of what we do as an RSA is possible without first having an awesome Executive team. A big thank you to Simon Lowde (Treasurer) who works tirelessly for the association. Stuart Hanrahan (Secretary) took over the secretary role in 2020 and has made significant contributions to the Board. It would not be possible to operate our association without the dedication of the entire board. The work they put in for their respective leagues is above and beyond.

To the committee presidents: Michael O'Neill – State League President, Helen Wyatt – Minor League President, and Brook Russell – Junior League President, a very sincere thank you. Darren Kelly who stepped into the role of Representative Coordinator has done an incredible job of getting all our Junior rep teams organized for their respective State Title campaigns. To the rest of the RSA board thank you for your support and contribution throughout the year. I'm looking forward to working with all of you again.

Finally, to all the individual members of each of the division committees, State League, Minor League, Junior League, and the Representative Committee; thank you for the wonderful job you do of running each division and keeping the game going.

Firstly, I would like to thank the Junior Baseball Committee for their tireless efforts in administrating baseball in the Manly Warringah District. The Committee dedicated a significant amount of their time to the betterment of baseball, both as representatives of Manly Baseball and their own clubs.

Competitions were run across all age groups from U8 to Senior League Ball with a total of 64 teams participating from all 4 clubs. It was unfortunate for Manly Baseball that the reformed North Shore Baseball Club was unable to participate in the 2020-2021 season.

The start of the 2020-2021 Manly Warringah Junior Baseball season saw the competition commence under the pall of the COVID-19 pandemic. Much of the planning for the season by all levels of Manly Warringah Baseball was undertaken with trepidation that season may not proceed, but cautious optimism that despite the social environment Manly Warringah had a robust and exciting season of baseball.

Despite a few isolated pockets of concern, particularly the Northern Beaches outbreak over our Christmas break, we had an outstanding season. The whole of Manly Warringah Baseball, committees, players, families, umpires, officials and volunteers are to be congratulated on what could not have been achieve without a herculean group effort.



Junior Baseball again ran a mid-week (Wednesday Night) Intermediate League competition. The competition involved 4 drafted teams with the players drawn from all clubs. The competition enabled many of the players to participate in two divisions during the season and the uniqueness of the draft system allowing many of the players to compete against team-mates from their Saturday teams and more diverse age group and skill levels. The result of which was the improvement of individual baseball skills by the end of the season. Several of the competition rounds coincided with State League rounds, enabling the younger players to witness high quality baseball, support the senior teams and see what awaits them if they continued their baseball career into adulthood.

The Senior Competition was again run on a Friday night with 4 teams participating from Forest, Pittwater and Seasiders. I would like to congratulate the Senior League players who have completed their Junior Baseball careers and hope that continue with baseball in the Senior Competitions.

The Junior Competition for 2020-2021 had 701 player registrations with the following breakdown:

The registration numbers and team numbers were an increase on the 2019-2021 season despite the environment of the pandemic. The Junior Committee and Club Committees should be congratulated on driving the growth of Manly Baseball, this should bode well for the competition in coming years.

The final series was hosted by Warringah Baseball Club. Congratulations to Kris Gailloux and the Warringah Club on running a successful final series. The Intermediate League finals played on Wednesday evening and the Senior League finals played on Friday evenings. The final series saw some intense games played across all divisions.



The Grand Final series had to be delayed a week due to the torrential rain that occurred. Despite the postponement, the Grand Final series was played on a beautiful autumn day. The day was started with the all teams, officials and spectators gathering for the Australian National Anthem and the ceremonial first pitch thrown by Warringah Baseball Club Stalwart, Brett Eisenhauer to his grandson and keen baseballer, Hunter Eisenhauer. Extra innings, tight score lines and exceptional individual play kept everyone on the edge of their seats during all of the games. The quality of the baseball played was outstanding.

Most of the boys I had known and coached for many years, some as far back as T-ball or zooka, so I was really looking forward to seeing them perform and compete at the U/18 level.

In a nutshell, our overall performance didn't go as planned. We competed strongly in most games, however we just didn't bring a consistent team performance week in week out to take the wins that were needed. In essence, we didn't always play to our potential, and we finished the season with 3 wins, 1 draw, & 9 losses, of which 7 of these losses was by 1 or 2 runs.

I therefore have mixed emotions in describing this season. On one hand I enjoyed every minute being with this fine group of young men (to which all the parents should be commended on raising their child with such great character), spending time with them at training, watching them take on the challenge of each week's game, & sharing my knowledge after a game on how they could improve or on how the game should be played. Then there is the other hand that felt the frustration & disappointment of what could have been. Unfortunately, we lost too many games by 1 or 2 runs, games that I felt we should have won. So, if I measured the success of the season on the boys learning and improving, on them competing and having fun, on them not giving up and fighting back during a game, then I would have to say it was pretty successful. If I measured it on the number of wins & whether we consistently played to our potential, then it was a bit disappointing.

To summarise the season on a results perspective; we finished 7th on the table, we scored 79 runs over 13 games, which meant that on average we scored 6.1 runs a game, however on average the other team scored 6.4 runs each game. That's 0.3 differential per game, such a small figure that had a big impact on our season. Our pitchers did well on the mound throwing 68.1 innings, giving up 68 hits, striking out 79, but struggled with 94 walks which is far too many. We made 19 errors in the field (not counting the mental errors), and as a team we batted 0.278, with 81 hits (64 singles, 13 doubles, 3 triples, & 1 homerun).

There are 2 key lessons that I want the boys to take away from this season:

- 1. When you play at higher levels of baseball, it's the little things that can have a big impact on a game (for or against you), hence its important to work on the small things.
- 2. Your challenge is to strive for consistency week in and week out while improving.

The little things: The more competitive and the higher the level of baseball you get to play, all the fundamentals and basics of playing the game are a given, it's the little things that happen in a game that start to make a bigger impact in the final result. In some games we did do the little things well to our advantage. We ran the bases aggressively, we had some good at bats moving runners over and scoring them, we picked runners off base, we made diving catches & solid plays in the field, we threw strikes and got ahead in the count which put pressure on the opposition batter. And then in other games, we gave teams too many runs that they didn't deserve. It was the little things like pitchers throwing too many walks, or players having a lapse in concentration and forgetting to cover a base or back up a play, miss reading balls hit in the field, fielders colliding by not communicating, & not putting 'bat on ball' or executing a bunt when we needed it. It's these small things that you take advantage of or get taken advantage of that normally result in an extra run or two scoring, and in most cases can affect the outcome of a game.

Consistency: At some stage throughout the season, I believe that everyone felt frustrated with the lack of wins we were getting. In my opinion, this was due to us not consistently playing to our potential. One week we would put together a great performance with everyone playing to their potential and walk away with a win. Then the following week lose by 1 or 2 runs because we let the 'bad' small things into our game. Whether it was walking too many batters, not making contact with the ball, or making a mental/physical error when the pressure was on, the fact is we weren't being consistent week in week out with our performance. This is a great learning experience for the boys on why it is so important, and what it takes to be consistent week in and week out. It is the challenge of consistency. As a retired player, I know that no one intentionally makes an error, or wants to strike out when we have runners on base, or a pitcher walking a batter etc. But this is the challenge that these young men must face as they progress with their baseball careers. We constantly reflect on what went well and what areas need more improvement, and we go and diligently work on it so that our performance becomes better and more consistent. It's the same process that elite players do day after day, week after week trying to improve on the small things while maintaining their consistency, so that when an opportunity presents itself in a game they are prepared and always ready to perform at their best.

What's a Season without a few unforeseeable injuries? Unfortunately for Lachie, just before our first game of the season he had emergency surgery to remove his appendix which resulted in him missing the first 4 weeks of the season, later in the season he sustained a shoulder injury diving for a ball which had him miss another 2 games. Wilson sustained an eye socket injury at training which left him on the bench for a week. Jacob cut his hand at school and had to miss a game, and then later in the season had a hamstring injury missing another. And finally, Zacca injured his shoulder at touch rugby and unfortunately missed the last game of the season.

Playing baseball is also about having fun. At the end of each game the boys would vote on the "Balls of Steel" award, normally given to someone who had a great game, or came up with a clutch hit, or made an awesome play. Throughout the season, Zacca won it 3 times (a bases clearing triple vs Central Coast, a bases clearly double vs Cronulla, & an outstanding diving catch vs Canterbury), Yuugou won this award twice for his hitting (double vs Blacktown & double vs Baulko), Sean won it once for getting 3 hits in a game (vs Macarthur), Max for a strong pitching performance (vs Canterbury), Jacob for his hitting (double vs Ryde), Daigo for a great pitching performance (vs Blacktown), Josh for his double and home run (vs Cronulla), Aidan for his first hit of the season (vs Central Coast), & Wilson for his pitching performance (vs Ryde).

Finally, I want to congratulate Tom, Zacca, Wilson, Josh & Max for being selected to participate at the NSW Showcase Series in March 2021. In addition, a special congratulations to Max Milner, Zac Newbold & Josh Beezley for also being selected in the U/18 Australian Selection Camp. Well done boys, that is a fantastic achievement, we are immensely proud and wish you all the best!

U/18 Manly Awards:

- <u>Batting:</u> Joshua Beezley: Josh led the team with a BA 0.464, slugged 0.714 & on base 0.625.
 He led the team with 5 HPB, was equal first with 12 RBI's, and he had our only home run of the season.
- <u>Pitching:</u> Max Milner: Max was our workhorse on the mound this year. He pitched 37 innings, gave up 32 hits, walked 47, struck out 43, & had an ERA of 5.8. I know he did a lot of off-season work and this has paid him dividends by being selected in the U/18 Australian Selection Camp.
- Fielding: Sean Parkinson: There were 2 key contenders for this award, one who was a great asset in the outfield who also made a number of great diving catches, and the other who made a great contribution towards the team by playing in a key position that he didn't want to while also playing it exceptional well. Sean made the sacrifice to catch the majority of the season for the team which prevented him from developing his own pitching game further. He stepped up for the team and was solid behind the plate, blocking many balls in the dirt, he took more control of the game & communication on the field, and he threw out 7 runners trying to steal a base. In addition, he would always have to catch multiple bullpens at training which often pushed his own pitching work and batting to after training hours.

- MVP: Joshua Beezley: Not only did Josh lead the team in batting but I also believe he had the most positive impact on the team. He always brought with him an energy that others could feed off, he always applied himself, he was humble, and he showed great leadership on the field. His defensive experience was an asset, he ran the bases aggressively, & he was equal first with 13 stolen bases. He was not just a great player for the team, he was also a great teammate who was more than happy to help others out and he was often found catching bullpens at training.
- <u>Players Player:</u> Joshua Beezley: Players voted on their Player of the year, congratulations to Josh as he received the majority of votes.

I wanted to thank Seb Elston, Tom Van Vessen & Jared Cupp who supported us from the Futures team when we were short on numbers. We greatly appreciated you guys giving up your time and I hope you enjoyed the experience.
