#### 5. President's Address

The President thanked and acknowledged all the club's sponsors, the Junior baseball club presidents, the members of the various committees and all of the people that come together within the association to facilitate baseball.

The President noted:

- That the RSA was formed in 2011 in an effort to unify all of baseball within the Manly Warringah area
- The Board and Executive addressed a great deal in 21/22 with accounting and budget transparency and accountability improved dramatically. A special thank you to Carly Clarke for her diligence and work as treasurer in these endeavours. Financial control has never been better

• A great deal was achieved from a governance perspective also with numerous Committee Charters drafted and adopted.

• Thanks to the Junior Competition Committee for delivering a staggering number of playing opportunities for junior baseballers this past Summer in the wake of unprecedented weather conditions and COVID-19

• Thanks to the Minor League Committee who worked tirelessly to ensure as many games as possible were able to take place this past year.

• Acknowledged Manly Eagles Baseball (State League Committee) and the great work that they did in returning to profitability especially given the limited number of games throughout the season.

• The MWDBA Constitution is outdated and difficult to work with. Hopefully the incoming board will make review and drafting a more suitable version a priority this coming year.

- The Junior Representative Program is in excellent shape thanks to the hard work of Chair Darren Kelly.
- The MWDBA Community needs to be conscious of the drop in junior player numbers

• Infrastructure for baseball in our region must remain a key priority over the next 5 years. The recently formed Infrastructure Committee has done magnificent work in prioritising projects and liaising with Northern Beaches Council

#### 7. Presentation & Adoption of Financial report

Carly Clarke presented the Association's Financial Report and spoke to the main components. Carly was approached by the Board in June 2021 to fill the casual vacancy left by the retired treasurer. Vicki Quinlan who undertook general bookkeeping duties as a volunteer was of huge assistance.

• Revised budgetary process now in place. All out of budget expenditure must now have Board approval

• All committees operated at a surplus or break even for the first time in many years.

• Accounting software was transitioned from MYOB to XERO which is much more user friendly and is cheaper to run. The treasurer is now in a good position to be able to deliver accurate monthly reports to the Board

• RL SMSF Audits was engaged to review the 2020/21 accounts and provided several recommendations to the Board which were all adopted.

• For the first time since amalgamation the current financial year accounts were able to be audited prior to the AGM. The auditor was extremely impressed with the quality of the accounts and provided no recommendations from 2021/22.

• The Board has made the decision to move away from holding inventory eg. Clothing and uniforms due to the substantial amount of money that has needed to be 'written off' in recent years.

• An Infrastructure fund has been set up to assist with the funding to future projects.

Welcome to the Manly Warringah District Baseball Association (MWDBA) Annual General Meeting for 2023.

The 2022-2023 season was another success for Manly Warringah District Baseball. With the COVID-19 pandemic firmly in the rear vision mirror, the baseball community looked to move from a difficult time for all, to a strong and exciting baseball season, unfortunately the historic rainfall of the previous season lingered.

Whilst John Fisher, St Matthews Farm and Rat Park had fared well, Aquatic Reserve was still suffering badly from the rains and was not available for the commencement of the season. Through the herculean effort of a band of dedicated volunteers, Aquatic was returned to a playable condition. I would like to thank and congratulate those involved in the restoration.

The unavailability of Aquatic Reserve for the commencement of the season meant that all the competitions had to rally together to manage the use of the other grounds. Another consequence, as with last season, the MWDBA was scheduled to hold junior state titles, but unfortunately had to withdraw from this commitment.

The Pittwater Baseball Club took up the hosting role. The Club, led by President Colin Rossello and a dedicated group of volunteers produced an exceptional environment for the Little League, Little League Division 2, Intermediate League, and Junior League State Titles. Their work included a significant investment in the infrastructure at Rat Park, which will benefit the Club for many years to come. Congratulations to all those that were involved in the endeavour.

Another unfortunate outcome of the pandemic is the deferment of the planned rectification works at Aquatic Reserve by the Northern Beaches Council. The Committee and Infrastructure Committee continued to engage with Council in the hopes that the works can return to the pre-pandemic timeframes.

The MWDBA Committee saw significant changes in its members with Renee Phegan joining as the new Secretary, new Directors, David Gledhill, John Hughes, and Luke Mallam and myself as the new President. The Committee's immediate focus was on the growth of the player numbers and the reduction of operating costs of the Association.

The Committee undertook a complete restructure of the marketing program of the Association, including the program costs, increased collaboration with the Clubs, control of webpage and social media platforms being returned to the Association and the use of analytical and targeted marketing approaches. The hard work of Carly Clarke, Luke Mallam and the Marketing Committee has seen substantial savings in this area.

All the competitions were profitable this season with revenue up significantly. The increase was driven by player numbers in the competitions moving back to pre-pandemic numbers, increase in canteen takings, players clinics, sponsorships, and

donations. This means the Committee can drive forward key infrastructure projects with purpose and confidence.

The State League competition has had a significant change this year with the incorporation of the competition to become Manly Eagles Baseball Club (MEBC). The new club being affiliated with MWDBA becoming the fifth club within the Association.

The competition had an outstanding year which was evidenced through increased spectator attendance which in turn resulted in a significant increase in canteen revenue. The competition saw spectator attendance that outstripped attendance at Sydney Blue Sox games. Several of the Wednesday night 1<sup>st</sup> grade games had crowds over 350. These results were due to the collaboration between State League and the Junior Competition Committee having the Intermediate League players and other junior club members attend the games, enjoying great canteen food and great baseball. It was a great pleasure for me to be asked to take over the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade team as the interim head coach for the season, to see the enthusiasm of the large crowds that drove the performance of the team. Separately, attendance numbers at their junior camps also increased.

Congratulations to Club Coach and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Coach, Tim Clarke on team winning the 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade State League competition and great results of all the State League teams. MEBC President Michael O'Neill and the committee are to be congratulated on the formation of the new club and the 2022-2023 season.

The Minor League competition suffered with the difficulties of the weather and ground conditions but nonetheless were able to run their usual cadre of competitions through summer and winter. This season saw the Minor League collaborate with the Pacific Coast Baseball League to expand the competition. The player numbers are again moving back towards pre-pandemic level, but I know that the Committee members are not resting on this result and are committed to growing participation. The importance of the Minor League competition cannot be understated. It is a vehicle to keep graduating junior players in baseball, introduce new adult players to baseball and give baseballers of all ages a great competition to continue with their baseball career. Personally, one of the most satisfying sights is seeing baseball being played for the pleasure of the game on the weekends and weeknights.

Congratulations to all of those that participated in the competitions and the winners of those competitions. Congratulations to President, Helen Wyatt, the committee, and all those hard-working volunteers that maintained the grounds and produced an exceptional cadre of competitions.

The Junior Competition was again another exceptional season, despite suffering from the same weather and ground conditions. The competition also saw player numbers return to pre-pandemic level. The Junior Competition is like no other in the metropolitan area, the Association is unique in the geographical, population constraints and proliferation of other junior sports on the peninsula. Despite this the Committee and the Clubs produce a quality competition participated in by great players, supported by their families. Junior baseball has always been a sport that the whole family can participate in and contribute to, and this is evident in the Manly Junior Competition. I enjoyed my visits to all other club grounds during the season, seeing kids on the diamond, parents and carers coaching or working in the canteen or scoring or umpiring the games. More importantly, I always enjoyed the cheering and enthusiasm for the safe hit, the great pitch or the play made regardless of the team on the field or in the batting box.

Congratulations to President Jayson Page, the Junior Competition Committee, the Club Presidents, their committees, and volunteers for a great season of baseball. Congratulations to all the division winners. Well done to Forest Baseball Club, President Owen Harris, Committee and volunteers on a great Junior Competition Finals. As important, thank you to the families that participate in the Junior Competition, and I encourage you all to continue with baseball after the kids graduate from junior baseball and talk to your friends and get them into baseball.

The Junior Representative Program is always a strong component of the Association. The small association that we are is not reflected in the quality of the players and coaches that participate in the All-Stars program.

The 2022 season saw the Senior League team win the State Title and finish 3<sup>rd</sup> in Nationals. Congratulations to PJ Patterson and coaches on the outstanding results.

The 2023 season has another strong turnout for the Representative program. The selection of 5 Rookies Cup teams including the 1<sup>st</sup> all-girl representative team was a highlight. Two of the teams going through the tournament undefeated. I am sure all the players had a great tournament for their first representative experience. Congratulations to the players and team management and keep coming back for representative baseball.

The other 2023 division teams trained hard in preparation for their State Champions and represented Manly in a very enthusiastic and professional manner. The atmosphere at all their games was great and the play that I saw at Pittwater was wonderful to see. As I said earlier, the atmosphere at the park was a credit to the Pittwater Baseball Club.

Congratulations to Luke Donaghey, James Landers, Dan Mills and Zac Morris on being selected in NSW State Teams. Congratulations to Dan Mills on Australian U18 Team selection and to James Peel on his selection in the NSW Country team.

Well done to the Representative Committee on fielding quality teams and managing the program.

The MWDBA continues to pursue the participation of girls and women in baseball. Our participation continues in the State League Women's 2<sup>nd</sup> grade competition, and I know that MEBC are continuing to pursue the inclusion of Manly in the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade competition. Congratulations to the Forest Baseball Club and Minor League on the 1<sup>st</sup> all female

team in this season's winter competition. The Committee hopes that the all-girl Rookies Cup team will be a continuing presence in the Representative Program.

It is with much sadness that this past season, Manly Warringah District Baseball lost two life members, Gordon Blinkhorne and Bill Hardman. Just this past week, we lost Jim Gagen, Jim was a great supporter and stalwart of Manly Baseball. They will all be sadly missed.

I want to thank the Manly Warringah Baseball Association Committee. The way the Committee worked together this season is to be commended. The meetings and all the communications in between were collaborative and productive. I am proud of the way the members used their own personal skill set to enhance and improve the performance of the Association. I appreciate the commitment and accountability that the Committee has demonstrated throughout the year. They made the leadership role that I took on an easy task.

This committee has continued the work started during the previous year and we place two resolutions before this Annual General Meeting as a first step to producing a new Constitution for the Association.

During this year, Mark Lowe resigned his position as a director. I would like to thank Mark for his committed service to Manly Baseball, through Pittwater Baseball Club, the Junior Competition Committee, the Representative Program and the MWDBA Association and wish him well in his future endeavours.

Another long-standing committee member Michael O'Neill will not be standing for election at this AGM. Michael has been involved with MWDBA since the competition committees amalgamated to become the MWDBA. His service to Manly Baseball extends back well beyond the current iteration of the Association and he continues his passion for Manly Baseball as the President of the State League Committee and the inaugural President of Manly Eagles Baseball Club. Thank you are not sufficient words for the contribution you have made and continue to make to Manly Baseball.

Thank you to the Manly Warringah Baseball Umpires for your continued commitment to Manly Baseball. The games could not be played without those committed umpires that we see week in and week out. Thank you for your commitment to the development of junior umpires. The Committee looks forward to a continued partnership with you. I would encourage all players young and old to consider the other participation component of baseball and join the Manly Warringah Baseball Umpires, it is a great way to contribute to the game.

Finally, to all the players, families, committees, volunteers, scorers, umpires, grounds keepers, canteen staff and everyone involved in Manly Baseball, I want to simply say thank you. Whilst the Committees often accept credit for the performance of baseball on the peninsula, we stand on the shoulders of giants, which is all of you, to make Manly Baseball the best Association in NSW, if not Australia (bias aside).

I encourage everyone that is involved in Manly Baseball, who does not already volunteer your time to do so in some manner, no matter how large or small that contribution may be.

I also encourage you all to consider roles in any of the Committees attached to Manly Baseball. No sport can operate without passionate Committee members who undertake the roles not for praise or adoration but to provide enjoyment in the sport of Baseball.

I have been involved in baseball for more than 50 years and I love the sport. I urge you all to maintain your passion for the game and hope that you will continue to love baseball as much as I do.

# Annual Treasurer's Report

Fiscal Year - March 2023



#### INTRODUCTION

The 2022-23 season was very successful year with a record number of rounds being played for both Juniors and Minors. It was the first of several years not to be affected by COVID restrictions and severe wet weather.

My focus as Treasurer is to ensure a financially strong and durable sporting association and to improve our infrastructure, hence providing more playing opportunities for all players. MWDBA continues to focus on the following strategies:

- The fiscal management of each playing entity ensuring they are contributing to the overall wellbeing of the association.
- Continuing to grow our player numbers through marketing and promotion.
- Reinvesting in the game particularly through infrastructure development providing more playing opportunities for the growing number of players.

This season was the first in several years where we were able to complete full rounds of the competition with the juniors completing 16 rounds plus 2 finals rounds and Minor League playing a record 19 rounds plus 2 rounds for finals. State League also had a successful season completing nearly all scheduled rounds.

#### FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

- An Infrastructure fund totalling \$80,925 was established for Minor League. This is to be used for major infrastructure projects including the upgrade of Aquatic Reserve. This account will earn over \$3k in interest income per year and we expect contributions of around \$10k per year going forward from Minor League fees.
- Manly Eagles Baseball Club (MEBC previously known as State League) recorded a record net profit of \$19.7k leaving them in a very solid financial position for the reaffiliation which occurred 1 April.
- Uniform inventory has been reduced very significantly over the past 3 years. As of April 2023, current uniform inventory for the association is only \$1.8k, down significantly from \$32k back in March 2020. As mentioned last year the idea is for players to purchase inventory direct from suppliers thus reducing the administrative workload and, also the significant uniform write-off costs experienced in previous years.

#### FINANCIALS

MWDBA financials are a combined set of accounts reflecting all the activities of the Association which includes Juniors, Junior Representatives, Minor League and State League. Minor League maintains three competitions Winter, Summer, Masters and State League includes Grade, U18's and Women's. Junior Representatives maintained 2 competitions this year – Sydney Cup and All Stars (State Championships). There have been some discussions about running a winter development program for Reps but at this stage many players are participating in external competitions for winter development.

#### RESULTS

MWDBA's total revenues for 2023 were \$249,987, very similar to the prior year. Profits were up 72% to \$42,451, however nearly half of this was attributable to State League and was transferred to MEBC in April as a result of the club reaffiliation. The remaining profit (\$22.8k) will go into retained earnings, securing funding for future infrastructure development, and ensuring a secure future for the association.

Note that State League had a very profitable year with net income of \$19.7k. This was mainly a result of a very successful Christmas camp bringing in \$16.9k in revenues, sponsorship revenues of \$8.9k and strong canteen profits of \$10.4k.

#### Manly Warringah District Baseball Association

MWDBA income is driven by several key revenue drivers being:

- Club and Player Registration
- Coaching Activities (player camps)
- Canteen
- Sponsorship & Donations

Overall revenue across MWDBA was similar year on year, however costs were down significantly helping to boost net profit. As an association we have been working hard to cut costs where possible as well as reduce inventory which has historically resulted in significant write-offs.

Overall, the gross profit – revenue less cost of goods was up significantly (\$10,909) on prior year.

#### ASSETS

Total Equity is up to \$179k of which retained earnings was \$137k and current year's surplus \$42.5k. Of this balance, it is predominately made up of a cash balance of \$185k.

Note that uniform inventory has been reduced significantly over the past 3 years. Uniform inventory was \$32.4k as of 31 March 2020, \$14.5k as of 31 March 2021, \$11.3k as of 31 March 2022, and \$8.5k as of 31 March 2023. After the MEBC reaffiliation, uniform inventory is only \$1.8k and we'll continue to reduce this to zero as players order directly from suppliers hence reducing the workload around inventory and the significant write-offs we faced over the past several years.

#### LIABILITES

Liabilities consist of accruals. Key accrued amounts represent end of season presentation costs for MEBC, AGM volunteer event, audit fees, advertising signage costs, MEBC coaching costs, host fees for imports and trophies.

#### PERFORMANCE

In summary, the overall net profit for the association was \$42.5k. Of this amount \$19.7k was attributable to State League and was transferred to MEBC in April when the club reaffiliation occurred.

#### **PLANNING**

The two key challenges that MWDBA continues to face are providing adequate grounds and growing player numbers. Over the past 12 months some progress has been made on plans to provide adequate grounds for the future. Additionally, MWDBA has set up an infrastructure fund totalling \$80.9k in order to support the improvement of our current grounds.

#### i. Grounds:

The use and demand of our sports fields in Northern Beaches is forever increasing and the Northern Beaches Council is actively looking to improve sports ground use.

The investment in North Narrabeen Reserve (Rat Park) has been completed with new state of the art baseball grounds.

Northern Beaches Council has pledged to refurbish Aquatic's baseball grounds with a focus on improved drainage, targeted for 2024-25. Additionally, there are plans to submit a development application for ground lights for fields A2-A5, as well as Rat Park 1. MWDBA plans to contribute to the project for ground lights via Infrastructure funding and grants applications.

#### ii. Playing Numbers:

Player numbers in MWDBA juniors rebounded in 2021 but dropped of significantly in 2022. COVID restrictions prevented clubs from being able to hold their usual try baseball days in July and August 2021 and all four clubs were down in terms of playing numbers year on year. Player numbers rebounded slightly again for the 22/23 season but there is still some work to do in getting player numbers back to levels seen in 2021.

Senior playing numbers had a very good year in 2021-22 with the transition of Juniors to Seniors continuing to improve, plus many parents of junior players signing up to play themselves. However, the wet weather in winter 2022 hurt playing numbers for the 2023 year with numbers across all competitions down year on year. Total minor league player numbers were down 18% compared to the previous year but have seen a compound annual growth rate of 4% over the past 5 years.

# Treasurer's Report 2022 – 2023

## Fiscal Year - March 2023

## INTRODUCTION

The 2022/23 season finishes with one of our biggest years in baseball. The Manly Eagles brand has significantly grown over the year which has successfully influenced all aspects of the club.

Key success of the year include:

- β Strong performance across the teams with 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade winning another gold medal in an exciting come from behind GF win. 1st grade, U18's and women's all in final contentions right up to the last game of the season.
- β Visitation to the Wednesday nights continue to grow making it a special night for spectators and the players.
- ·β A very successful Christmas camp with the support of Blue Sox internationals contributing to a two day event with 100 participants on each day.
- β Strong canteen results supported by fine weather allowing us to present 6 of the 7 home games.
- β Solid sponsorship results aided by the NSW women's grant.
- β Another successful Pink Hope charity event generating over \$3,000 in donations.

Manly Eagles is more than just a game, it's an event that combines the spectacle of the game, the presentation of good food & beverage and the comradery and passion of the baseball community. The last few years have been challenging, with bushfires, pandemic and significant flooding all of which have threatened the sport however, I'm pleased to say we have bounced back strongly bringing together one of our best years.

## LATEST ESTIMATE - RESULTS

MEBC results are still being prepared with the financial year close being 31 March 2023. It is my expectation that total revenues for 2023 will be \$79k which is 11% higher than prior year. I expect we will have a surplus of \$18.6k which is well up on prior years.

## FINANCIALS

The results have been greatly influenced by a number of successes this season which include

- Strong numbers across the club.
- A very successful Christmas camp which generated 100% over budget
- Canteen activity up 130% on the back of high visitation and fine weather allowing us to present
   6 homes game rounds.
- A \$5,000 grant from NSW to support women in sport and the continuing support of our valued sponsors.

During the season expenditure spent was equal or below budget. Some key expenditure includes

- Canteen expenses were firmly managed which resulted in a 40% profit margin for the year. This
  was a focus for the season to improve and sets the foundation for continuing growth.
- Additional playing equipment providing new helmets across the club and bats for the women's team.
- Marketing investment to develop a 30 sec and 2 min reels of Wednesday night baseball capturing the fun and activity of the night that will support ongoing promotion for the 2023/24 season.
- Expensing the Pink Hope playing tops that have been used for the Pink Hope charity event.

## ASSETS

The results of 2022/23 will provide a good injection of cash to MEBC ensuring that we have a reasonable foundation to launch MEBC Inc. Members Equity is expected to be \$20.6k of which \$2k is retained earnings and \$18.6k is current year's surplus.

During financial year of 2024 we will need to acquire our playing tops and other uniform items from MWDBA which will equate to a purchase of \$6.7k

Other assets include

- Two hack attack machines
- The batting igloo
- EBSN equipment
- Other general equipment used to support the game and canteen

There are no current or long term liabilities.

## PERFORMANCE

In summary, the overall surplus of \$18.6k reflects a very strong performance for MEBC and provides a solid foundation for 2023/24 season.

## PLANNING

In preparation for the next season I note the following key challenges.

i. Grounds:

Aquatic Reserve, the home of Manly Eagles continues to be challenged for local and state government infrastructure. The field is very susceptible to rain and general weather conditions which can rule out use very quickly.

Since the flooding during 2022, the supply of diamond sand is limited and what we have received is of poor quality. Clay for the mounds has been unavailable which reduces the durability with all day use.

Collectively, this puts pressure on the maintenance and presentation of the grounds week to week.

## ii. Coaching & player retention:

As with prior years, we are currently well supported by eager and qualified coaching and MEBC is incredibly grateful for the time and effort that they commit to the sport.

MWDBA will continue to look at ways of supporting our coaches and ensuring that infrastructure and equipment is available to support their efforts.

Player retention continues to be a challenge and we need to do more to keep our juniors in the sport. Manly has a number of its players playing in the US college program and while we wish them all the success it adds to the retention challenges for the upcoming season. We will go out early in 2023 to source import interest for next season which has been a key component to club success.

## iii. Volunteer support:

MEBC is blessed with great volunteers and support from parents and family. This is key to our continuing success and we need to keep attracting support and interest from the baseball community as we continue to build this club for the future players.

While we are progressing with these challenges, I look forward to the continuing support of MWDBA, MEBC and the baseball community as we promote and improve Baseball in this region.
