To the Manly Baseball Community,

I am the current President of the Manly Warringah District Baseball Association. Previously, the Chair of the Junior Competition Committee for 4 years.

I have been involved in Manly baseball since 2010 as a player, coach, and administrator. My family are all active members of Manly Baseball. This past season, I coached in the Forest Futures Program and coached the first grade State League team.

I have been involved in baseball for more than 50 years.

Manly Baseball is unique in the NSW baseball community, being a collaboration of the Junior Competition, Junior Representatives, Minor League, and State League. We are unique geographically in the Sydney baseball community.

My goal for the coming season would be to continue the collaborative approach of the Committee and the Clubs to continue the growth of baseball through investment in the infrastructure.

This has helped to grow junior player numbers for FBC. As part of the board this year we have already begun working on plans to implement for the 2023/24 season. Philip (PJ) Patterson (Secretary)

I have been involved in baseball in Manly for the last 18 years serving as Club President at Forest from 2006-2012, Manly Junior Baseball Committee (now the JCC) for 7 years, a founding board member of the RSA in 2012 and its chairman for 7 years. I've coached both junior and representative teams in Manly for the last 18 years with notable achievements being a national's qualification in 2019 with Little League Major and in 2022 coaching the Manly U16 rep team to a NSW State Championship for the first time since 2001 and at Nationals finishing 3rd winning a Bronze medal.

I am a member of the umpires association (MWBU), umpire regularly, and have played in the minor league for the last 16 years in winter, summer and Masters.

As a qualified financial adviser with a BA in Economics I've owned and operated a financial advisory firm for the last two decades servicing over 200 clients, managing funds exceeding 30 million; all with a team of 5.

I believe the key areas of focus for MWDBA going forward are: growing junior baseball, improving facilities, continuing the governance initiatives including fiscal accountability, promoting and expanding the pathways available for all levels of baseball player.

I have since played in the Manly Minor League competitions over various periods over the last 25 years

Items I feel the RSA needs to focus on for our continued success are

- implementing the constitutional changes regarding the board make up (if approved) as well as continual review.
- continued pushing of the timeline for the redevelopment and the lighting of Aquatic reserve to make sure it remains on track for it to be the proud home of Manly baseball as it has always been.
- RSA to continue the monitoring of unnecessary costs and cutting them if deemed excessive.
- Having the funds used for running recruitment programs for our future junior players being easily accessible and accounted for.
- Continue to be a strong supporter of further competitions for all our members and I will continue to push to make sure these have a clear path to be run.

Melissa Bristow (Director)

What baseball, personal and or business experience do you bring to the role?

My baseball experience is at grassroot level being a parent, manager and registrar at Warringah Baseball. I understand the experiences new families have when starting baseball and the steep learning curve involved in a new, unfamiliar sport. I have 2 vastly different sons in the sport and I can understand how the sport supports each of them for different reasons as well as what will turn them away from the sport as a whole.

My personal and business background is revolved around building confidence, resilience and self-esteem in youth. This in particular is one of the reasons I would like to be on the board as sport in particular is one of the many ways we can build our kids (and adults) mental fitness which in turn will help with the ever evolving mental awareness and build a micro community of support. I also have experience organising events and project management in the building industry and high school exchange programs. All of this experience can be used in youth and adult programs.

I am also the fundraising committee member for Cromer Public School's music committee and grant writer at Warringah Baseball Club,

What do you believe that MWDBA needs to focus on to ensure ongoing success?

I feel MWDBA has done a great job at growing the sport but there are always ways to continue moving in a positive direction and improving.

I think all 4 clubs should be brought together to work as one to promote baseball on the Northern Beaches with all clubs benefiting from marketing and anything else used to



promote the sport. I believe a combined marketing campaign for baseball as a sport and appropriate involvement of schools and the wider community we can grow the sport from a grassroot level.

It is also important to understand how we can keep the kids playing baseball during their high school years, it has been proven that kids who stay in sport throughout their teen years benefit not just physically but mentally as well and this age group feed into the adult league which in turn will grow and develop.

The development of the Junior reps program and number of participants in the program is growing which is great for the association, we need to continue to work on this and add similar development for coaches and umpires which is also important as the association grows.

Principal strategic focus of the incoming RSA board.

1. Grow juniors. As Manly Juniors president we grew the juniors' numbers to approximately 950 players alas falling short of my goal of 1,000 players. This should be the principal goal of the incoming RSA board as junior players become senior players feeding into both the minor league and state league.

2. Repair the current constitution. The wording of the current constitution is weak and unclear however the established principles of equal representation across the competition



committees needs to be maintained and made clear. This requires the addition of 2 more board members to allow for the representation of the new Junior Rep Committee (an excellent addition).

This should be achieved in the first month of the new board.

3. Grow minor league. Goal - to offer a graded minor league competition in both winter and summer such that an adult player of any ability, age, and gender can participate.

4. State League: Goal – to provide an elite baseball experience for any player wishing to develop and test their abilities at senior levels and provide a pathway to higher levels such as the ABL.
